## Questions

1. Why did the Emperor want to find a boy to be the next emperor? *The Emperor was getting old and he did not have a son to take his place.*

2. Who did the first three advisors suggest as the future emperor? *The first advisor suggested the Emperor’s nearest relative. The second advisor suggested the son of the richest man. The third advisor suggested the general’s son.*

3. What qualities did the Emperor want the next emperor to have? *The next emperor should be wise, courageous, and honest.*

4. How did the Emperor come up with a test? *Sun Han suggested a test to the emperor.*

5. How did the Emperor's advisors choose boys for the test? *The advisors went to their villages and found the wisest and most courageous boys who also loved truth.*

6. What did the advisors think about the Emperor's plan? *They questioned the wisdom of the plan.*

7. What did some people in the kingdom think about the Emperor's plan? *At first they thought it must be wise, but when they heard what it was, they thought it was foolish.*

8. What did the seven young boys have to do? *They were to take containers with seeds and try to grow them for one year. Then the Emperor would examine the plants and determine a new emperor.*

9. When the boys got home, what did they do? *They went to the library and researched the best soils and how much water to use.*

10. After two months how did the boys' plants do? *Everyone's plant was growing well except Ming's plant, which had not sprouted at all.*

*He felt like a failure and was ashamed that he wasn't able to grow the seed.*

17. How did the six boys feel when the Emperor announced the winner and why? *The six boys were ashamed because now everyone knew that they had cheated.*

18. How did Ming feel about winning? *He was shocked and happy.*

19. Why hadn't any of the seeds grown? *The seeds had been cooked, so they could not grow.*

20. How was Ming rewarded? *He and his family moved to the palace for his training and, eventually, he became the new emperor.*

21. What kind of emperor did Ming become? *He became a courageous, wise, and honest emperor who always did what was best for the kingdom.*
